

The New Jewish Writer: Themes and Identity



Instructor: Rabbi Mindy Avra Portnoy April 26, May 3, May 10 at 8:15 p.m.

This class will focus on short stories as an introduction to several outstanding Jewish-American authors of the 21st century. Our main texts will be Molly Antopol's The Unamericans (2014), Erika Dreifus' Quiet Americans (2011, and David Bezmozgis' Natasha (2004). All these writers offer a contemporary lens on both previously-explored and lesser-examined subjects, including the lives and experiences of Soviet Jewish emigres; the effect of the Holocaust on subsequent generations; the McCarthy era; family relationships; the meaning of home and exile; and American/Jewish identity generally. The classes will incorporate both lecture and discussion. Copies of the texts will be made available in class, but students are particularly encouraged to purchase or borrow from local libraries Molly Antopol's text (in paperback).

**Rabbi Mindy Avra Portnoy,** Rabbi emerita of Temple Sinai, currently serves as Adjunct Rabbi at Congregation Beth El. She has written five Jewish children's books, including *Ima on the Bima: My Mommy is a Rabbi* and *Matzah Ball*, and has taught adults in the Washington, DC area for the past 37 years.


