Whether you are a Jew, Christian, agnostic, or seeker, if you want to experience the basics and essence of Judaism, this course is for you! It uses basic Jewish texts to explore what Jews study, how they observe Judaism in their homes, and what prayer and community mean to them. The course covers how Jews observe the Sabbath and holy days, and how Jewish laws and principles shape every part of the lifecycle. Participants will experience Judaism directly through by eating at a kosher restaurant, studying a text together, exploring a synagogue and attending services as a class, and sharing together in a Friday night Sabbath dinner with the teacher and his family.

The participants will be ready to go deeper into what can become a lifetime of Jewish living and study.

Session I: How to Study Torah Online

Tuesdays Jan. 26, Feb. 2, 9, 16 7:15-8:30PM

Online resources can be a fabulous gateway to independent study of Jewish text and tradition. But navigating this vast and jumbled new "sea" is tricky. Where are the treasure troves and the pitfalls? When should they point you back to more traditional, offline sources? Join local scholar Virginia Spatz, whose blog, "Opening the Book," an online guide to studying the weekly Torah portion, appears on the Jewish Study Center website.

<u>Session II: How to Give a Great D'var Torah</u> Tuesdays Feb. 23, March 2, 9, 16 7:15-8:30PM

Nothing teaches you about the weekly parasha like presenting your own ideas to the congregation. Many congregations ask for members to give such d'var torah, commentary, because they want to see the unique perspectives that each of us can bring to that. But how do you get started? Beyond those notes at the bottom of the page, how do you dive in, structure your ideas, and build on what others have said? In this course, experienced lay scholars discuss different approaches to a d'var Torah, readily available sources, personal styles, and tricks of the trade. Coordinated and moderated by Sheldon Kimmel with guest instructors Norman Shore, Joyce Stern, Virginia Spatz and David Nemeth.

Sheldon Kimmel has taught for the Jewish Study Center and helped bring the Latke-Hamentasch symposium to the DC area.

This year's "Adas Israel Reads" program focuses on Revenge: A Story of Hope, the thrilling story of how journalist and Adas member Laura Blumenfeld tracked down the Palestinian terrorist who shot her father. This classic modern text of revenge becomes even more interesting when read in the context of traditional rabbinical teachings on revenge. Is it permitted? Forbidden? Mandatory?

<u>Judaism and Islam-Mirrors and Echoes: Islam as Faith and Social Order</u> Thursday, March 4 7-9PM

The course will cover major theological concepts and issues within Islam and the way they have shaped Islam's political development. We will also look at the sociopolitical implications of these concepts for contemporary Islam.

The instructor, *Naiem A. Sherbiny* is the senior representative in the U.S. of the Cairo-based Ibn Khaldun Center for Development, and a board member of Library of Alexandria Foundation. Formerly a senior economist at the World Bank, he has taught at Berkeley, Wisconsin, Harvard, Georgetown, and American University at Cairo.

Judaism and Islam-Mirrors and Echoes: Tales from the Koran and Torah:The Joseph StoriesThursday, March 117-9PM

Abraham, Joseph, Moses, and many other familiar characters are central in the Koran as well as the Hebrew Bible. In this class the instructors, Afroze Mohammed and Stephanie Lowitt will trace the stories about Joseph, or Yusuf, through both scriptures, and learn how this always fascinating character is pivotal to both Jewish and Muslim traditions.

Afroze Mohammed is an independent management consultant who grew up in both Washington, DC and Islamabad, Pakistan and has a strong interest in interfaith understanding. Afroze has spoken on Islam to diverse religious groups. *Stephanie Lowit* runs her own marketing and communications consulting business, Maestro Marketing. Born and raised in New York, Stephanie was educated in the conservative Jewish tradition. She and her family are members of Temple Sinai. Afroze and Stephanie have been close friends since they attended graduate school at the Yale School of Management.

<u>Forum: Is There Free Speech In—And About-- the Middle East?</u> Thursday, March 18 7-9PM

In some countries, the wrong kind of speech can land you in prison. In other places, speech is free, but communities strive to impose their own unofficial constraints on what can and cannot be said. Can we talk about the Middle East in a balanced way when the freedom to criticize varies so dramatically between countries? Do inhibitions and insecurities in the American Jewish community skew what "can be said" even in a free system? Our panel explores the challenges to free expression in Israel, in Arab lands, and in debates on the Israeli-Arab conflicts here at home.

The moderator, *Charles Feinberg* is associate rabbi at Adas Israel Congregation.


